

Canada and Mexico are the U.S. Largest Export Market for the U.S.

- ***Canada and Mexico the largest U.S. Markets in the world: Canada is number one and Mexico number two market representing 15.49% and 15.45% respectively of total U.S. goods exports***
- ***Mexico - U.S. agricultural trade, a pillar of North America's food security: Mexico is the leading supplier of agricultural products to the U.S. and the second-largest global destination for U.S. agricultural exports***

Mexico City, January 8, 2026 - According to trade data released by the U.S. Department of Commerce¹, from January to October 2025 U.S. goods exports to Mexico accounted for approximately 15.45 percent of total U.S. exports, while exports to Canada represented about 14.49 percent. For the fourth consecutive month, Mexico remained the United States' largest export market, and since 2023 it has also been the largest single source of U.S. imports. This performance underscores the strength, depth, and resilience of North American production integration.

Key sectors driving this integration include machinery and equipment, vehicles and auto parts, electronics, medical devices, steel, energy and a large variety of agricultural products. Together, these sectors anchor North America's global competitiveness and highlight Mexico's strategic importance in U.S. industrial sourcing.

Mexico - U.S. agricultural trade: a pillar of North America's food security

Agricultural trade between Mexico and the U.S. has significantly grown over three decades of economic integration and trade liberalization. From January to October 2025, Mexico consolidated its position as the primary supplier of agricultural products to the U.S. and as the second-largest global destination for U.S. agricultural exports.

Mexico and the U.S. are complementary agricultural partners. On one hand, Mexico stands as a reliable food supplier, exporting a wide range of high-quality agricultural products in significant volumes, including avocados, berries, beer, tomatoes, lemons, among others. On the other hand, Mexico is an important purchaser of U.S. agricultural exports, including pork, poultry, and beef, dairy, apples and pears, corn, wheat, leguminous vegetables, rice, and other products, positioning the country as a key economic partner for agricultural producers across multiple U.S. states.

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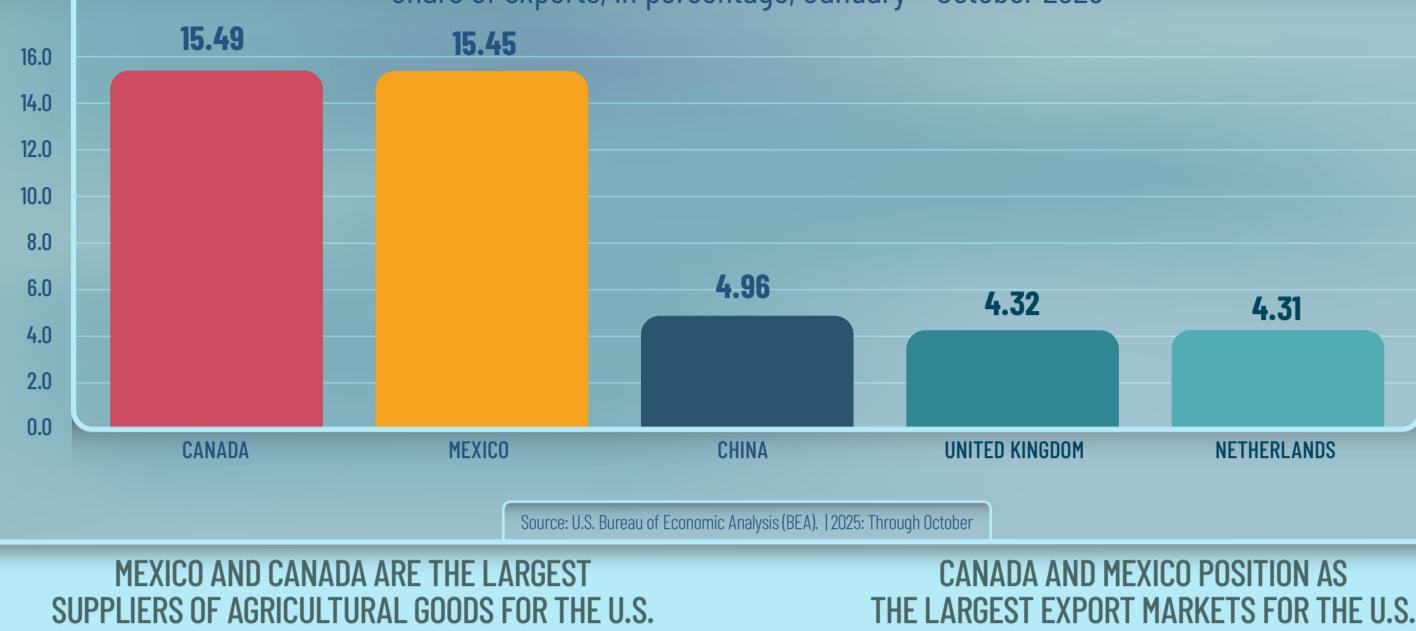

REPRESENTING 15.49% AND 15.45% RESPECTIVELY OF TOTAL U.S. GOODS EXPORTS

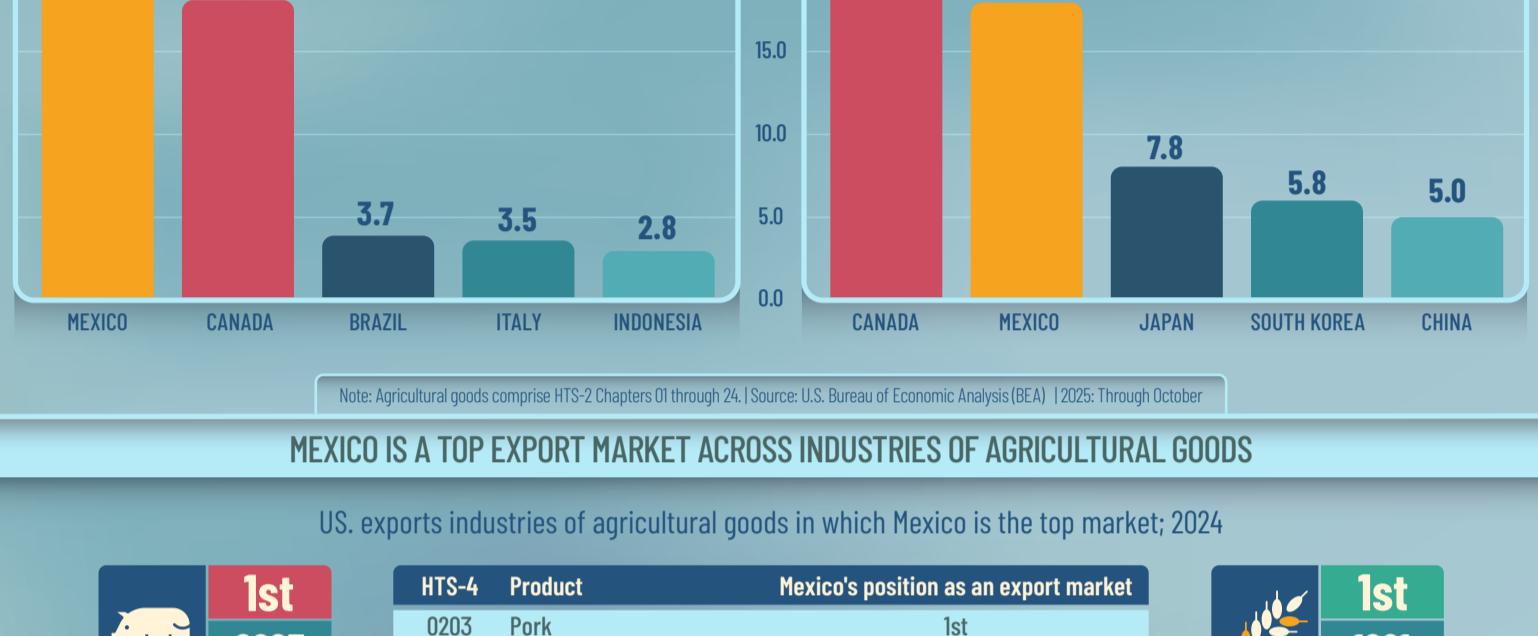
Share of exports, in percentage: January - October 2025

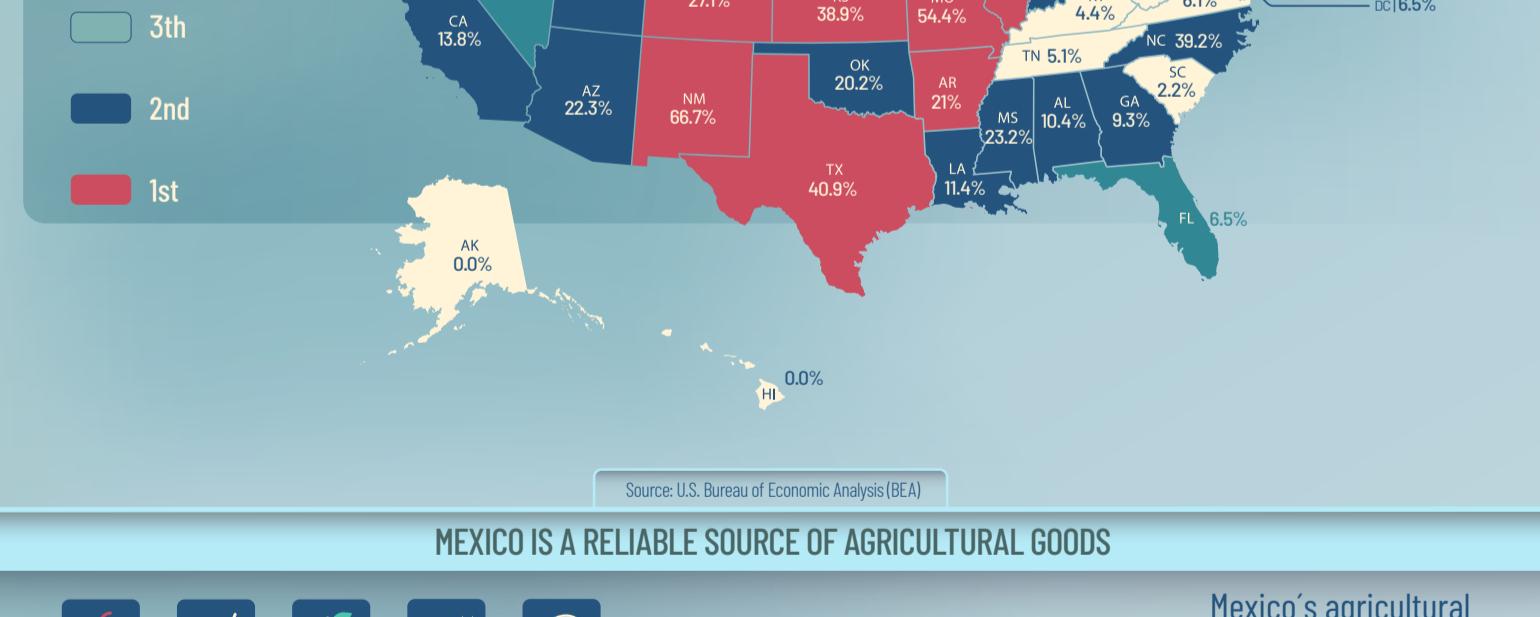
